RE: Liquidation instructions for chlorinated isocyanurates from the People's Republic of China exported by the PRC-wide entity for the period 06/01/2010 through 05/31/2011 (A-570-898)

1. For all shipments of chlorinated isocyanurates from the People's Republic of China exported by the PRC-wide entity (A-570-898-000) entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption during the period 06/01/2010 through 05/31/2011 (except those covered by message number 3038302 dated 02/07/2013 and in paragraph 3 below), assess an antidumping liability equal to 285.63 percent of the entered value. During the period 02/04/2011 through 05/31/2011, certain entries by the PRC-wide entity may have entered under A-570-898-009.

2. The notice of lifting of suspension of liquidation for entries of subject merchandise covered by paragraph 1 occurred with the publication of the final results of administrative review (78 FR 4386, 01/22/2013). Unless instructed otherwise, for all other shipments of chlorinated isocyanurates from the People's Republic of China, you shall continue to collect cash deposits of estimated antidumping duties for the merchandise at the current cash deposit rates or per-unit amounts.

3. The injunction with court number 13-00061 in message number 3043301 dated 02/12/2013 is applicable to the entries exported by Hebei Jiheng Chemical Co., Ltd. and imported by Arch Chemicals, Inc., during the period 06/01/2010 through 05/31/2011. The injunction with court number 13-00056 in message number 3043302 dated 02/12/2013 is applicable to the entries exported by Juancheng Kangtai Chemical Co., Ltd., during the period 06/01/2010 through 05/31/2011. Accordingly, until further notice continue to suspend liquidation of these entries until liquidation instructions are issued.

4. The assessment of antidumping duties by CBP on shipments or entries of this merchandise is subject to the provisions of section 778 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended. Section 778 requires that CBP pay interest on overpayments or assess interest on underpayments of the required amounts deposited as estimated antidumping duties. The interest provisions are not applicable to cash or bonds posted as estimated antidumping duties before the date of publication of the antidumping duty order. Interest shall be calculated from the date payment of estimated antidumping duties is required through the date of liquidation. The rate at which such interest is payable is the rate in effect under section 6621 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for such

period.

5. Upon assessment of antidumping duties, CBP shall require that the importer provide a reimbursement statement, as described in section 351.402(f)(2) of commerce's regulations. The importer should provide the reimbursement statement prior to liquidation of the entry. If the importer certifies that it has an agreement with the manufacturer, producer, seller, or exporter, to be reimbursed antidumping duties, CBP shall double the antidumping duties in accordance with the above-referenced regulation. Additionally, if the importer does not provide the reimbursement statement prior to liquidation, reimbursement shall be presumed and CBP shall double the antidumping duties due. If an importer timely files a protest challenging the presumption of reimbursement and doubling of duties, consistent with CBP's protest process, CBP may accept the reimbursement statement filed with the protest to rebut the presumption of reimbursement.
