RE: Correction of message 5055308, dated 02/24/2015 concerning the AD order on PET film, sheet, and strip from Brazil (A-351-841)

1. This is a correction to message 5055308, dated 02/24/2015 to correct the header.
2. The header of message 5055308 contains an incorrect lifting of suspension date. The lifting of suspension date should be 02/06/2015. The body of the message remains unchanged and is contained below for your convenience.
3. As a result of a five-year ("sunset") review, Commerce has revoked the antidumping duty order on polyethylene terephthalate film, sheet and strip from Brazil (A-351-841). The revocation was published in the Federal Register on 02/06/2015 (80 FR 6689). The effective date of the revocation is 11/10/2013.
4. CBP is directed to terminate the suspension of liquidation for all shipments of polyethylene terephthalate film, sheet and strip from Brazil (A-351-841) which were entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption on or after 11/10/2013. All entries of polyethylene terephthalate film, sheet and strip from Brazil that were suspended on or after 11/10/2013 should be liquidated without regard to antidumping duties (i.e., refund all cash deposits with interest).
5. Do not liquidate entries of the subject merchandise entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption prior to 11/10/2013 until separate and specific liquidation instructions are issued.
6. Notice of the lifting of suspension of liquidation of entries of polyethylene terephthalate film, sheet and strip from Brazil (A-351-841) covered by paragraph 4 and which were entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption on or after 11/10/2013 occurred with the publication of the notice of revocation in the Federal Register (80 FR 6689, 02/06/2015).
7. The assessment of antidumping duties by CBP on shipments or entries of this merchandise is subject to the provisions of section 778 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended. Section 778 requires that CBP pay interest on overpayments or assess interest on underpayments of the required amounts deposited as estimated antidumping duties. The interest provisions are not

applicable to cash or bonds posted as estimated antidumping duties before the date of publication of the antidumping duty order. Interest shall be calculated from the date payment of estimated antidumping duties is required through the date of liquidation. The rate at which such interest is payable is the rate in effect under section 6621 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for such period.
