RE: Liquidation instructions for certain frozen warmwater shrimp from China exported by Zhanjiang Regal Integrated Marine Resources Co., Ltd. for the period 02/01/2011 - 01/31/2012 (A-570-893)

Notice of the lifting of suspension occurred on the message date of these instructions. See paragraph 3 below.

1. On 1/21/2016, the U.S. Court of International Trade issued a final decision in the case of Ad Hoc Shrimp Trade Action Committee v. United States (CIT 13-00346). As a result of this decision, the TRO and injunction to which message 3296302 refers enjoining liquidation of entries which are subject to the antidumping duty order on certain frozen warmwater shrimp from the People's Republic of China for the period 02/01/2011 through 01/31/2012 exported by Zhanjiang Regal Integrated Marine Resources Co., Ltd., dissolved on 03/21/2016.
2. Commerce has determined that Zhanjiang Regal Integrated Marine Resources Co., Ltd. did not make sales at less than fair value during the period of review. Therefore, CBP is instructed to terminate the suspension of liquidation for all shipments of certain frozen warmwater shrimp from the People's Republic of China exported by Zhanjiang Regal Integrated Marine Resources Co., Ltd., (A-570-893-060) and entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption during the period 02/01/2011 through 01/31/2012, and to refund any cash deposits and release any other security. Entries may have also been made under A-570-893-000.
3. These instructions constitute notice of the lifting of suspension of liquidation of entries of subject merchandise covered by paragraph 2. Accordingly, notice of the lifting of suspension occurred on the message date of these instructions. Unless instructed otherwise, for all other shipments of certain frozen warmwater shrimp from the People's Republic of China you shall continue to collect cash deposits of estimated antidumping duties for the merchandise at the current rates.
4. There are no injunctions applicable to the entries covered by this instruction.
5. The assessment of antidumping duties by CBP on shipments or entries of this merchandise is

subject to the provisions of section 778 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended. Section 778 requires that CBP pay interest on overpayments or assess interest on underpayments of the required amounts deposited as estimated antidumping duties. The interest provisions are not applicable to cash or bonds posted as estimated antidumping duties before the date of publication of the antidumping duty order. Interest shall be calculated from the date payment of estimated antidumping duties is required through the date of liquidation. The rate at which such interest is payable is the rate in effect under section 6621 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for such period.
