RE: Automatic liquidation instructions for glycine from the People's Republic of China for the period 03/01/2015 through 02/29/2016 (A-570-836) (A-533-975)

1. Commerce does not automatically conduct administrative reviews of antidumping duty orders. Instead, reviews must be requested pursuant to section 751(a)(1) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, and in accordance with 19 CFR 351.213.
2. Commerce created case number A-533-975 to accommodate entries of merchandise classified as country of origin India for Customs purposes, but subject to the antidumping duty order on glycine from the People's Republic of China (PRC). See, e.g., message number 2353309, dated 12/18/2012, and final affirmative determination of circumvention of the antidumping duty order on glycine from the PRC (A-570-836) (77 FR 73426). Consequently, merchandise entered under A-533-975 is considered subject to the antidumping duty order on glycine from the PRC (A-570-836).
3. Commerce has not received a request for an administrative review of the antidumping duty order for the period and on the merchandise identified below except for the firms listed in paragraphs 4 and 5. Therefore, in accordance with 19 CFR 351.212(c), you are to liquidate all entries for all firms except those listed in paragraphs 4 and 5 and assess antidumping duties on merchandise entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption at the cash deposit or bonding rate in effect on the date of entry:

Product: Glycine

Country: PRC

Case number: A-570-836 and A-533-975

Period: 03/01/2015 through 02/29/2016

4. Entries of merchandise of the firms listed below should not be liquidated until specific instructions are issued. Continue to suspend liquidation of all entries of merchandise exported by the listed firms entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption during the period 03/01/2015 through 02/29/2016:

Company: Baoding Mantong Fine Chemistry Co., Ltd.

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Case number: A-570-836-007

Entries may also have been made under A-570-836-000, A-533-975-001, A-533-975-003, A-533-975-061, A-533-975-063 or other company-specific numbers

Company: Kumar Industries

Case number: No case number was in place for this company during the period of review. Entries may have been made under A-570-836-000 or other company-specific numbers.

Company: Rudraa International

Case number: No case number was in place for this company during the period of review. Entries may have been made under A-570-836-000 or other company-specific numbers.

CBP officers must also examine entries under A-570-836-000 and all existing company-specific case numbers to ensure the continued suspension of liquidation of entries during the applicable period of review for the exporters listed above.

5. Entries of merchandise of the firm listed below should not be liquidated until specific instructions are issued. Continue to suspend liquidation of all entries of merchandise produced and/or exported by the listed firm entered, or withdrawn from warehouse, for consumption during the period 03/01/2015 through 02/29/2016:

Company: Jizhou City Huayang Chemical Co., Ltd.

Case number: No case number was in place for this company during the period of review. Entries may have been made under A-570-836-000 or other company-specific numbers.

CBP officers must also examine entries under A-570-836-000 and all existing company-specific case numbers to ensure the continued suspension of liquidation of entries during the applicable period of review for the producer and/or exporter listed above.

6. There are no injunctions applicable to the entries covered by this instruction.

7. Notice of the lifting of suspension of liquidation of entries of subject merchandise covered by paragraph 3 occurred with the publication of the notice of initiation of administrative review for the 03/2016 anniversary month (81 FR 26203, 05/02/2016). Unless instructed otherwise, for all other shipments of glycine from the PRC you shall continue to collect cash deposits of estimated antidumping duties for the merchandise at the current rates.

8. The assessment of antidumping duties by CBP on shipments or entries of this merchandise is

subject to the provisions of section 778 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended. Section 778 requires that CBP pay interest on overpayments or assess interest on underpayments of the required amounts deposited as estimated antidumping duties. The interest provisions are not applicable to cash or bonds posted as estimated antidumping duties before the date of publication of the antidumping duty order. Interest shall be calculated from the date payment of estimated antidumping duties is required through the date of liquidation. The rate at which such interest is payable is the rate in effect under section 6621 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 for such period.

9. Upon assessment of antidumping duties, CBP shall require that the importer provide a reimbursement statement, as described in section 351.402(f)(2) of Commerce's regulations. The importer should provide the reimbursement statement prior to liquidation of the entry. If the importer certifies that it has an agreement with the producer, seller, or exporter, to be reimbursed antidumping duties, CBP shall double the antidumping duties in accordance with the above-referenced regulation. Additionally, if the importer does not provide the reimbursement statement prior to liquidation, reimbursement shall be presumed and CBP shall double the antidumping duties due. If an importer timely files a protest challenging the presumption of reimbursement and doubling of duties, consistent with CBP's protest process, CBP may accept the reimbursement statement filed with the protest to rebut the presumption of reimbursement.
