RE: Scope determination on antidumping duty order on aluminum extrusions from the People's Republic of China (A-570-967).

1. On 09/12/2013, in response to a request by Law St. Enterprises, LLC ("Law St."), Commerce issued a final scope determination that Law St.'s disappearing door screens ("disappearing screens"), devices that may be installed across a door opening as a screen, but may be retracted and concealed when not in use, which Law St. imports, are within the scope of the antidumping duty order on aluminum extrusions from the People's Republic of China (A-570-967).
2. Because the imported product meets the physical description of the scope language and does not fall under the finished goods kits exclusion in the scope, Commerce found this product to be within the scope of the order. Specifically, the merchandise, as described in the request (multiple packages of disappearing screen parts that are part of a single entry but are not packaged as individual sets), at the time of importation, does not constitute a packaged combination of parts to fully assemble a disappearing screen. Rather, the merchandise constitutes separately packaged parts that, after importation, must be un-packaged, re-arranged, and re-packaged before being sold to the end user as a finished goods kit that includes all of the parts needed to fully assemble finished disappearing screens.
3. Continue to suspend liquidation of entries of aluminum extrusions from the People's Republic of China, including disappearing door screens imported by Law St. described above, subject to the antidumping duty order on aluminum extrusions from the People's Republic of China.
