RE: POSTPONEMENT OF PRELIMINARY ANTIDUMPING DETERMINATION

1. The Department of Commerce published in the Federal Register January 28, 1992, notice of the postponement of the due date of preliminary antidumping duty determination in this investigation from February 5, 1992, until no later than February 14, 1992. Additionally the Department is extending the due date for the final countervailing duty determination to correspond to the date of the final antidumping duty determination with respect to the same product and country. The final determination for both cases, unless extended, will be April 2, 1992.

2.The product covered by this investigation is extruded rubber thread from Malaysia. Extruded rubber thread is defined as vulcanized rubber thread obtained by extrusion of stable or concentrated natural rubber latex of any cross-sectional shape, measuring from 0.18 mm, i.e., 0.0 inch or 140 gauge, to 1.42 mm, i.e., 0.056 inch or 18 gauge, diameter. Extruded rubber thread is currently classified under subheading 4007.00.00 of the Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS).

3.In accordance with section 705 of the Act and Article 5, Paragraph of the Subsidies Code, the U.S. Customs Service should terminate the suspension of liquidation in the countervailing duty investigation April 28, 1992, which is 120 days from the date of publication of the preliminary determination. No cash deposits or bonds for potential countervailing duties will be required for merchandise which enters or after April 28, 1992. The suspension of liquidation will not be resumed unless and until the Department publishes a countervailing duty order. Furthermore, Customs should hold any entries suspended between December 30, 1991, and April 27, 1992, until the conclusion of the investigation.

4.For further reporting purposes, the countervailing duty case has been assigned investigation number C-557-806 and the antidumping duty case has been assigned number A-557-805.
